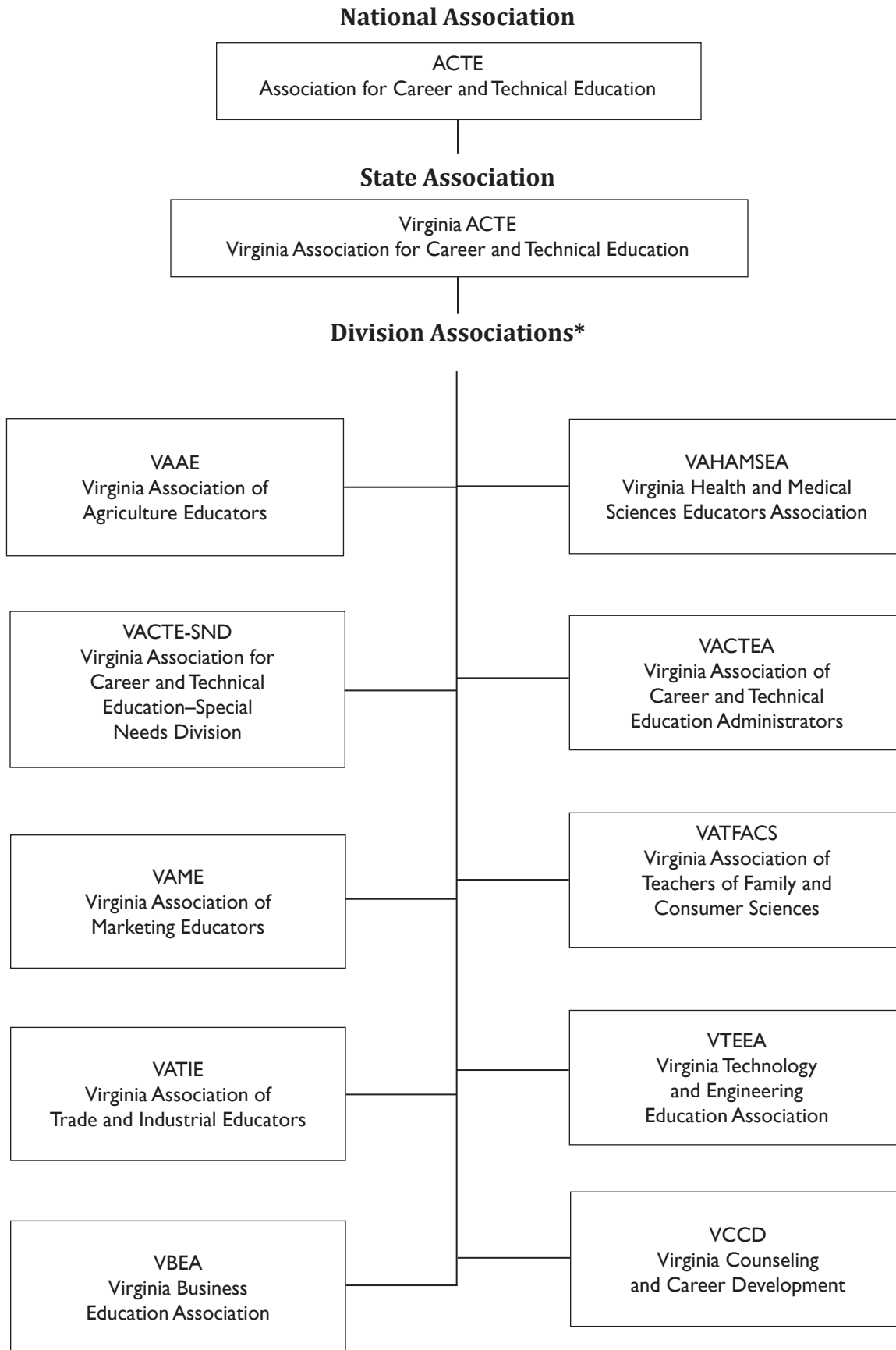

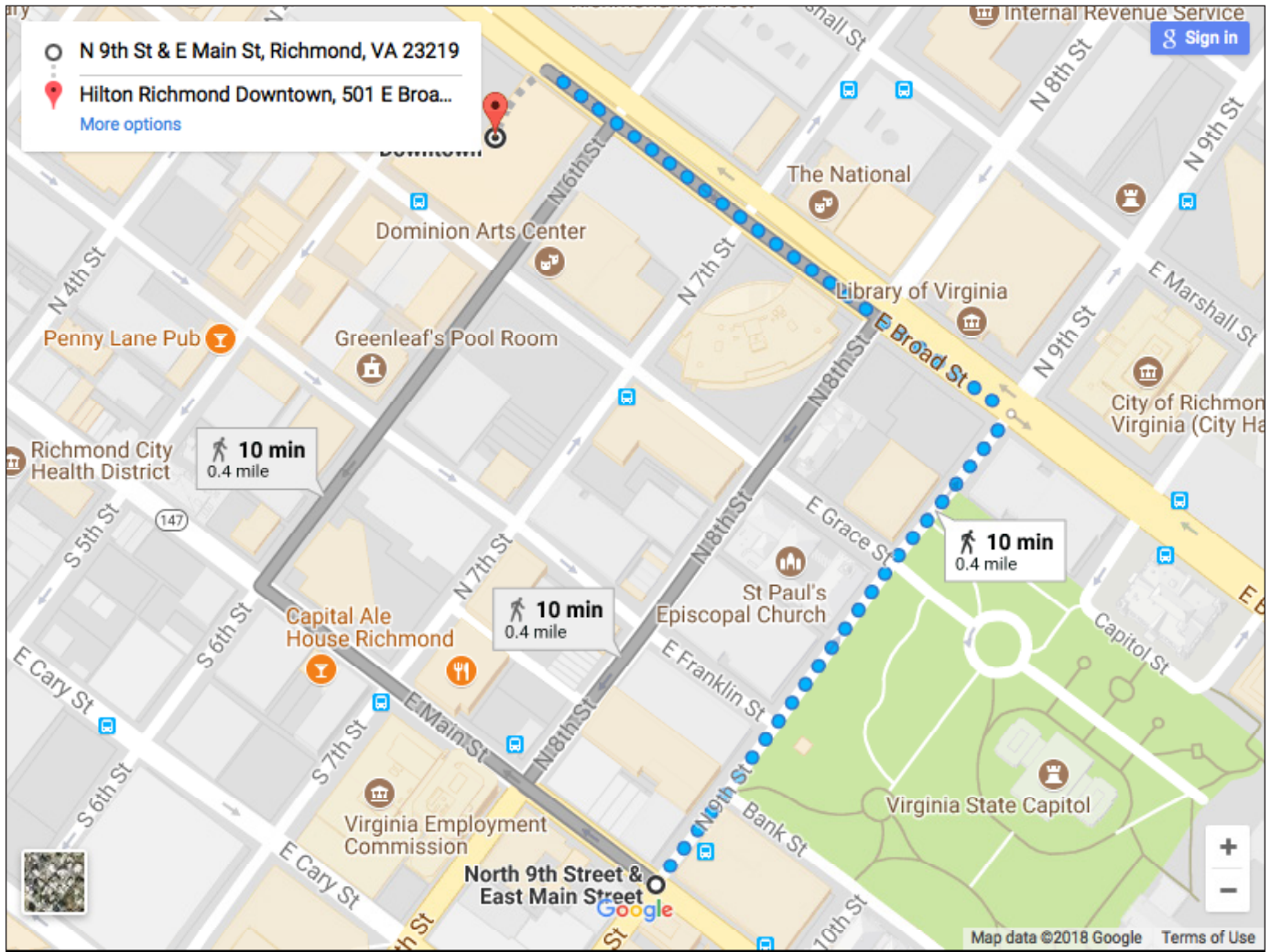


Virginia Association for Career and Technical Education Organizational Chart
